A postal spokesman said rubber bands have the advantage of repeated use and flexibility, breakless often and are cleaner than twine because they don't raise as much dust, 'and produced a savings in that they were more efficient,'

The GSA official said tubber hands also may yield a finan-cial savings compared with twine.

Postal technicians said the thickening at an end on the specially designed rubber bands is to provide more strength.

The idea for rubber bands was put to a test starting about six years ago in New England, after postal officials there noticed success of similar use in Canada, the postal spokesman

Economists View One Bank Holding Companies

signed an amendment to the Bank Holding Act of 1956 that regulates one bank holding

companies, Prior to this legislation, one enter Calthough the banking subsidiaries were regulated as far as banking functions were concerned). Most did not abuse this privilege, as diversification occurred primarily in financially related fields such as mortgage companies, small loans, and data processing companies.

Nevertheless, it was decided that this loophole should be closed because of acquisition overtones by conglomerates, the increased competition between banks which resulted in their seeking new fields of endeavor. and the rapid growth in the number of one-bank holding companies

For example, in 1966 there were only 641 banks controlled by one bank holding companies and these represented less than five per cent of total bank deposits. By the end of 1968, however, 783 one-bank holding companies were in existence or being formed, which represented more than 27 per cent of the industry's total deposits

SOME BREAK-UP ANTICIPATED

Because of this law some one-bank holding companies which were in operation prior to June 30, 1968 (the grandfather clause data) may be required to divert themselves of their non banking activities.

By the same token, some companies whose prime functions are not banking may choose to spin off their banking operation. Smaller holding companies

may also be forced to divert some of their non-related ac-tivities if the Federal Reserve Board finds "that the banks" power to grant or deny credit be influenced by a desire to further the holding company's other interests.

The holding companies have ten years to divert themselves of these activities after they have been ordered to do so

The Federal Reserve Board played an important role in the making of this legislation, as its opinions were sought at various stages, particularly during the final draft

The Act itself offers only suidelines and gives the Fed great latitude in drawing inmitations as to what activities are to be permitted. In making its decisions, the important
